






Ian Cruickshank has been guiding birding walks for Swan Lake Nature Sanctuary and the Victoria Natural History Society for the past 10 years. He has done bird and biology fieldwork across western Canada with Bird Studies Canada, Rocky Point Bird Observatory and Parks Canada, and currently works at Pacific Rim National Park Reserve.

Join local naturalist Ian to learn about and see a wide suite of birds found in the forests and shores of Ayum Creek, and get a crash course in birding by ear. We will also identify plants and discuss natural history along the way.

This walk will be moderately difficult due to crossing the creek itself. Bring your binoculars and hiking boots!



Help restore a Garry oak ecosystem! TLC is continuing the Garry oak Ecosystems Recovery Team (GOERT) restoration project to save the endangered (red-listed) White-topped aster (*Sericocarpus rigidu*) near the summit of Mill Hill Park. We will continue the battle against Scotch Broom which is threatening the integrity of the sensitive Garry oak meadow. Pull broom in bloom and see the beautiful colour show the native wildflowers have to offer!

MEETING SPOT: Meet us on Legacy Ridge!

Directions: From the Trans Canada Highway, take Exit 14 and head south. Turn left on Strandlund Road and continue to the T-intersection. Turn right on Selwyn Road, left on Mill Hill Road, right on Langvista Drive, right on Kingsview Ridge and right on Legacy Ridge. Park in the visitor stalls at the top of road. Carpooling is recommended as parking is limited at the site. Please contact TLC if you're interested in cutting your carbon footprint!



MEETING SPOT: Meet us at the Nursery!


Directions: NALT's Native Plant Nursery is located at 3145 Frost Road in Nanaimo. From Nanaimo head toward the Nanaimo Airport on the Island Highway. Just after you cross over the Nanaimo River, and before the silver bridge, there is a road called Spruston Road. Turn right onto Spruston Road. Travel under the underpass and proceed down Spruston Road for approximately 2 km. On your left will be Frost Road. At the end of Frost Road is the Natural Abundance Native Plant Nursery.






Leanne has had her work featured at the Emmy's, the American Country Music Awards and has won awards for her pastel, watercolour, acrylic and pencil techniques.

Nature Sketch aims to inspire appreciation of the natural world using a pencil and sketchbook, offering a cultural lens for exploring the outdoors. Guided by an artist and a naturalist, this family outdoor nature workshop encourages children to connect to nature by focusing on sketching and observing wildlife habitats in unique ecosystems.





MEETING SPOT: Abkhazi Garden Entrance



Kem Luther, author of "Boundary Layer", examines the often overlooked world of fungi, moss and lichen and their critical roles in ecosystem function. Rich Mably, a volunteer for over 20 years with the CRD as a park steward, is a fungiphile and photographer who is always keen to get outside.

Join Kem and Torrey on a hunt to find and identify mushrooms in the beautiful mature forests at Mt. Work. Participants will learn how to ID the most common species, deadly species, the parts of the mushroom fruiting body, and discuss the role of fungi in forests.



MEETING SPOT: Mount Work Regional Park parking lot on Munn Road

Directions: From Victoria heading north on Hwy 1, turn right onto McKenzie Ave and turn left onto Burnside Road West. Turn right onto Prospect Lake Road and finally left onto Munn Road. The parking lot will be on your right after Fork Lake Road.

Join Jo Wyld as she guides you through the steps to creating your own festive wreath. Wreath making is an ancient practice of twisting natural materials into circular celebrations for such events as weddings, sporting activities and seasonal changes. Our hands-on workshop will use garden inspired, mixed natural foliage to honour the change from Autumn to Winter. Participants will create their own 12 to 14 inch take home wreath. This is an outdoor workshop, under an open tent with a patio heater, so please dress for the weather


Participants are asked to bring their own ribbon and wreath forms. Items are available to purchase for \$20 per participant when registering.




MEETING SPOT: Abkhazi Garden Entrance

Directions: Abkhazi Garden is located at 1964 Fairfield Road. From downtown Victoria follow Fairfield Road for about 4 km to reach the garden – you will pass Cook St, Moss St, the Ross Bay Cemetery, St. Charles St and finally Foul Bay Rd. The Garden is one block past Foul Bay Rd. Street parking is available, preferably on the north side of Fairfield Rd, adjacent to the garden. Identifying mosses can seem daunting at first, so come learn in the forest from an expert! Common mosses, and hopefully rare ones too, will be identified and you will learn basic moss features to help you ID in the future. A short walk along the old water pipeline trail will take a long time to complete as we stop every few feet to identify the dozens of mosses found in this beautiful, privately owned, mature forest. This walk will require moderate hiking abilities. Please remember your water and appropriate footwear.


Looking to get more involved? We are always looking for volunteers to join our team. Check out the following 5 ways you can get involved this year!

- Covenant Program volunteers, often UVic and VIU students, learn about monitoring, ecological integrity and scientific reporting. This training helps support the next generation of conservationists.
- Last year volunteers helped remove 136 m³ of invasive species, collected approximately 60 pounds of garbage and restored a 2,500 ft² area previously blanketed with invasive species.
- Gardeners at Abkhazi Garden have been lovingly caring for the magical space since TLC purchased the site. Plant sales and donations fund their work including purchasing plants and tools.
- Not all of our volunteers spend time digging in the dirt. A team of friendly greeters welcome visitors to Abkhazi Garden and our docents bring a wealth of historical knowledge to each tour.
- From postage stamp sorting to stuffing envelopes, volunteers help TLC achieve our routine office tasks. Donating a few hours each week, these valued volunteers are an integral part of TLC's team!
