

### **Bird Walk**

Presented by Ian Cruickshank at the Millstream Creek Watershed.
Meet at the Mary Lake Nature Sanctuary at 1772 Millstream Road.

Ian Cruickshank has been guiding birding walks for Swan Lake Nature Sanctuary and the Victoria Natural History Society for the past 10 years. He has done bird and biology fieldwork across western Canada with Bird Studies Canada, Rocky Point Bird Observatory, and Parks Canada, and currently works at Pacific Rim National Park Reserve.

Join local naturalist Ian to learn about and see a wide suite of birds found in the forests and shore of Mary Lake, and get a crash course in birding by ear. We will also identify plants and discuss natural history along the way.

This walk will be moderately difficult due to crossing the creek itself. Bring your binoculars and hiking boots!

co-held by TLC and HAT. Many groups have participated in creek, riparian, and forest restoration efforts over the past 25 years to support the salmon-bearing Ayum Creek and interconnected ecosystems. Since 2017, TLC has been conducting a restoration research project at Ayum Creek to determine an effective method for controlling periwinkle (Vinca minor), a garden-escapee invasive plant. Preliminary results from this project have shown a significant decrease in periwinkle where "lasagna-gardening" has been placed.

During the upcoming work party, volunteers will join TLC in continuing efforts in controlling periwinkle and celebrate the UN Decade of Restoration by participating in Make A Difference (MAD) Week!

There will be snacks as well as prizes from the MAD Week crew. Please dress in layers, wear sturdy footwear, and bring water.
